- PJM and NYISO staff efforts currently focused on testing data exchange capabilities to support M2M with NYISO
- Development and testing efforts to date have gone well
- Testing activities continue on the latest version of PJM's Enhanced Market Flow Calculator
- The M2M implementation project is currently on target for completion in the 4th Quarter, 2012



- All Phase-Angle Regulating Transformers (PARs) were initially placed into service and began regulating operations on April 5, 2012
  - Operational issues with the PARs prevented the consistent operation of these devices until June 29
- FERC Hearings on the PAR cost allocation began August 13<sup>th</sup>




# 2011 Average Hourly IESO-MISO MW Flow: April thru July




#### 2012 Average Hourly IESO-MISO MW Flow: April thru July

# Michigan-Ontario PAR Performance Summary

 The April through July average interchange values across the IESO to MISO interface for 2011 and 2012 are as follows:


Year	Scheduled	Actual	Loop Flow
2011	598	424	-173
2012	773	814	41

 Loop flows are significantly lower and are well within the 200 MW bandwidth on average since April 2012





- MISO and PJM held the first of a series of Joint Stake-holder Meetings July 16 to continue discussions on seams issues. The purposes of these meetings are to:
  - Identify the most critical seams issues to be addressed
  - Establish the priority for addressing the issues identified
  - Establish the framework for issue resolution
- MISO and PJM presented a list of seams issues based on stakeholder feedback to serve as a starting point
- Panelist presentations and discussions were also provided at the first stakeholder meeting



# MISO/PJM Joint Stakeholder Meeting Follow Up

- Stakeholders were requested to provide additional seams coordination opportunities to PJM and MISO by July 30
- PJM and MISO staffs completed their review of feedback from stakeholders and developed issue/problem statements for consideration and possible action at the second stakeholder meeting scheduled for August 24
- At the August 24 Joint Stakeholder meeting, PJM and MISO staff will
  - Review feedback received from stakeholders
  - Present issue/problem statements developed from feedback received
  - Discuss potential steps for moving forward
