



New Expiration Process for Secure Area Access

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Corporate Communications

- Access to PJM.com secure & critical energy infrastructure information (CEII) content currently never expires.
- No FERC requirement to expire access
 - FERC expires their *own* CEII content annually.
- Access to expire every:
 - **1 year** for non-members
 - **3 years** for members
- Users to be notified to renew their access.
- Clients to be responsible for reviewing consultant access.

If user is not signed in or does not have access:

FERC Form No. 715

Confidential and Proprietary - Do not distribute

FERC has determined that to satisfy section 213(b) of the Federal Power Act, potential customers must be able to reasonably anticipate the outcome of technical studies a transmitting utility would perform that assess the availability of transmission capacity to satisfy a request for transmission service. Therefore, each utility or its designated agent must submit an annual report.

Once user clicks *Renew Now*:

FERC Form No. 715

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Access expires in 5 days. Renewal request pending.

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Email reminders to also be sent before expiration.

- April 24 – Initial changes go live – no impact to stakeholders
- Throughout Q2 – expiration rolled out in phased approach; all users will be emailed, if they are effected.
