



VOTING RESULTS – LONG-TERM CAPACITY AUCTION

Background

Following a WebEx straw poll conducted in the CSTF meeting on June 6th regarding how to proceed with development of a Long-term Capacity Auction (LTCA) construct, the following vote was taken between June 7th and June 11th. The vote is intended to provide data to the MRC on how the group should proceed with a FERC filing due August 1st and future work on the issue of developing a LTCA. This vote was open to members and affiliates, and is not sector weighted.

Voting Questions

Question 1: Please select one option regarding the development of business rules for a Long-Term Capacity Auction by the Capacity Senior Task Force (CSTF).

1. Stop - Stop working on development of a Long-Term Capacity Auction.
2. Continue - Continue working on development of a Long-Term Capacity Auction.

Question 2: If the group continues the development of business rules for a Long-Term Capacity Auction, which of the following timelines is most preferable.

1. Continue; current timeline - Continue working on development of a Long-Term Capacity Auction for an August 1, 2012 FERC Filing date in order to implement prior to the 2013 BRA.
2. Continue; pre-2013 BRA Target - Continue working on development of a Long-Term Capacity Auction and target an October 1, 2012 FERC Filing date in order to implement prior to the 2013 BRA.
3. Continue; pre-2014 BRA Target - Continue working on development of a Long-Term Capacity Auction and target an October 1, 2013, or earlier, FERC Filing date in order to implement prior to the 2014 BRA.



Question 1: Stop or Continue?
