



Guide to MSRS Report Format Documentation

This guide outlines the information found in the report format documentation that has been created to support the initial release of the new MSRS reports.

The following pages contain a template of the standard report format documentation. Content descriptions have been added within each section in order to explain the information that will be included in the documentation for each individual report.

1 Report

MSRS Report Name: <Lists new MSRS report name>

Related eSchedules Report Name (old): <Lists the name of the existing eSchedules report that is related to the new MSRS report>

Report short name for User Interface: <Lists the Report short name that will be displayed on the MSRS User Interface>

Download File Name Abbreviation: <Lists the abbreviated name for the report. This abbreviation will appear in the file name of the downloaded reports>

Data Granularity: <Lists the granularity of the data that is displayed on the report (ex. Hourly, Daily, Monthly)>

Frequency: <Lists the frequency with which the report is posted (ex. daily, monthly)>

Range Displayed on Report: <Lists the range of data that will be displayed on the report (ex. Start Date through End Date or Start Month through End Month). This distinction is important since all reports will be requested in the MSRS UI using Start Date and End Date. For reports that are displayed for start month / end month ranges, the start date entered in the UI will be converted to the first day of the month and the end date entered in the UI will be converted to the last day of the month in order to determine the range of data that should be displayed on the report.>

2 Supported Billing Line Items

- <Lists all billing line items (and their corresponding line item codes) that are supported by the details in this report>

3 Report Content Summary

<Provides a high-level summary of the report contents and when data will appear on the report>

4 Summary of Changes and Special Logic

- <Lists the following types of information (where applicable):
 - Major changes in content between the new MSRS report and the related eSchedules report

- Special handling for the daylight saving time switch days
- Information on any additional functionality that deviates from the reporting standards>

5 Report Columns

<Includes a table that lists the column names that appear in the online, CSV and XML formats of the report, as well as the associated column number and data type>

6 CSV Report Example

<Provides the name of the file that contains the example CSV format for this report.>

7 XML Report Example

<Provides the name of the file that contains the example XML format for this report.>

8 Hyperlinks

<Indicates whether the online version of the report contains hyperlinks to related reports or not. If the report contains hyperlinks, the hyperlinked columns and the reports to which they link will be listed.>

9 Supporting Calculations

<Contains calculations for those values that can be calculated using information contained entirely within this report. Values are referenced by both their column header name and their numeric column identifier in these calculations.

Ex. Column A Name (Column A Number) = Column B Name (Column B Number) * Column C Name (Column C Number)>

10 eSchedules Report Column Mapping

<Provides a summary mapping of the eSchedules Report Column Name to the MSRS Online and CSV Column Name; where applicable.>
