About Exelon Corporation

Exelon is a Fortune 100 energy company with the largest number of utility customers, one of the cleanest, lowest-cost power generation fleets and largest retail customer bases in the U.S. The Exelon family of companies participates in nearly every stage of the energy business, from generation and power sales to transmission and delivery. Headquartered in Chicago, the company does business in 48 states, the District of Columbia and Canada. Exelon had 2018 revenue of \$36 billion and trades under the ticker symbol EXC.

Energy Delivery

Exelon's six utilities deliver electricity and natural gas to approximately 10 million customers in Delaware, the District of Columbia, Illinois, Maryland, New Jersey and Pennsylvania through its Atlantic City Electric, BGE, ComEd, Delmarva Power, PECO and Pepco subsidiaries.

Energy Generation

Exelon Generation is one of the largest competitive power generators in the nation, with owned generating assets totaling nearly 32,500 megawatts. Exelon is the largest owner and operator of nuclear plants in the United States and is the largest producer of carbon-free energy.

Competitive Energy Sales

Constellation is Exelon's competitive retail and wholesale energy business. Constellation and its companies provide an array of innovative energy products and services to customers across the United States and in Canada. Headquartered in Baltimore, Constellation serves approximately 2 million residential, public sector and business customers, including more than two-thirds of the Fortune 100.
